5. Impact of 2017-18 plan					
Maths	96% made expected progress. Of the 29 pupils identified who did not meet the required expectation for maths and received Catch-up intervention, 28 made expected progress, 1 was below expected progress in Y7.				
English	94% made expected or above expected progress. Of the 38 pupils identified who did not meet the required expectations for English (Reading) and received Catch-up intervention, 17 exceeded expected progress, 19 made expected progress and 2 were below expected progress in Y7.

The results gained in 2017-18 academic year have resulted in a more detailed & rigorous plan in place for the year 2018-19. This plan will be monitored throughout the academic year to ensure its effect is maximised.
