In Year 9

In Year 10

Why study Fine Art?

- Through the work you create you will be introduced to a range of materials such as; paint, pencil, oil pastels, chalk, inks, ceramics and other 3D materials, printmaking, photography.
- You will create a portfolio on boards as well as sketchbooks.
- You will learn about and be inspired by other artists.
- Your work will be exhibited at the school and you can invite people you know to come and view it.
- You will be invited to KS4 clubs at lunch and after school to extend your learning.
- You will not have a written exam, instead you will have a practical one to show off all you have learnt at the end of Year 11.
