They had the opportunity to visit the shed where the legendary author crafted his most beloved children's books, discovered the locations in the village that inspired his tales, and even brainstormed some of their own story ideas! As well as studying Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, the children have been developing their persuasive writing skills along with character descriptions and poetry.

In maths the focus has been on multiplication and fractions which will continue into the new year with the addition of decimals and percentages too. We have worked incredibly hard in our science lessons investigating materials. Each class had exciting lessons learning about water, reversible and non-reversible changes and what happens when materials are mixed! It was a wonderful experience!

EXCITING NEWS FROM YEAR 6!

This term, year 6 students have thoroughly enjoyed two exciting themed topics. We started with a thrilling exploration of "Stormbreaker" book 1 of the spy series by Anthony Horowitz, followed by a deep dive into the Victorian Era. As a 'scintillating start' to our Victorian Era topic, we had the pleasure of visiting the British Schools Museum, Hitchin.



This visit gave the children a hands-on opportunity to step back in time and experience what life was like for a Victorian child.

The experience included a session in a Victorian classroom where the children practiced the 'three Rs' using slates and ink pens. Some students even had the full experience of Victorian discipline—one ended up wearing the 'dunce's hat' while another was 'caned' for a small misdemeanour! The visit continued with a tour of the schoolmaster's house, followed by a session of 'drill' in the yard, where the children lined up and practised military-style drills. While everyone found the day fascinating, most students agreed that they preferred their modern classroom setting!

We have been reading "Street Child" in English. This has inspired a range of writing activities, including letter writing, diary entries, narratives, and a persuasive pieces. In maths, we have focused on mastering the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), fractions, and converting units.

This year, we have continued setting for maths, which has proved very successful. The year 6 team is incredibly proud of how the students approached their mock SATs. They embraced the challenges with determination and a positive attitude, showing real perseverance and have been able to reflect on the progress they've made. It's important for the children to remember that the mock SATs are just a chance to demonstrate what they've learned, and there's no need for concern. In the new year, SATs books will be available for you to order via ParentMail to support continued learning.

In addition to their academic achievements, many students have represented the school in various sports and taken full advantage of the extracurricular clubs on offer. Our form prefects also took part in 'tree-planting' behind A block and managed to plant sixty tree saplings. Donated by the Woodland Trust as initiative and supports Etonbury's ongoing commitment to enhance biodiversity, sustainability and ecology on site and contributes to the 'Oxford to Cambridge National Forest Project'.

In the new year, we look forward to our next topic of We Will Never Surrender, based around World War 2. As a compliment to this topic, we will be visiting The Imperial War Museum, Duxford to enhance our learning. In English, we will be using the text, "Goodnight Mr Tom" by Michelle Magorian.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the unwavering support of the year 6 team, who are fully committed to helping each child navigate not only the academic challenges of their final year of primary school, but also the emotional ones. We know that the nurturing environment created by teachers, staff, and parents plays a vital role in supporting the children's growth. We are very proud of how hard the students have worked this term, and we look forward to seeing them progress further in the new year.

An Exciting Day of Innovation and Learning!

On 21st November, year 8 and 9 HPA students at Etonbury Academy had the incredible opportunity to experience a day of hands-on learning and high-speed excitement, courtesy of STEMx by Oracle Red Bull Racing. The visit was an unforgettable experience that combined the thrills of motorsport with the fascinating world of technology and engineering.

In their sessions the students participated in a series of engaging challenges that put their creativity, problem-solving skills, and teamwork to the test. From the Pit Stop Challenge, where students raced against the clock to change a car's tyres, to the Coding Challenge, which introduced them to the basics of computer programming, the sessions were packed with activities that sparked curiosity and excitement. The Racing Challenge put the students 'behind the wheel' allowing them to create their own mini cars and race them against each other, learning about aerodynamics, speed, and the importance of precision engineering. The day was topped off with a careers session, opening their minds to the hundreds of different people and their jobs behind motorsport and F1.

Throughout the day, our students demonstrated exemplary behaviour, working collaboratively and enthusiastically. Their dedication and teamwork were outstanding, and it was clear that they were fully engaged in the STEMx experience. 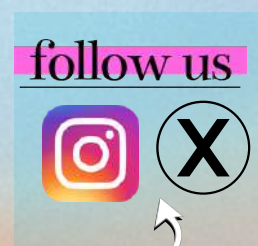

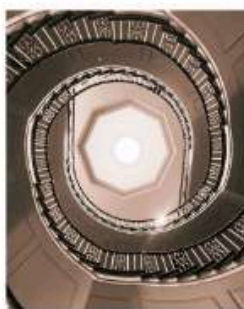

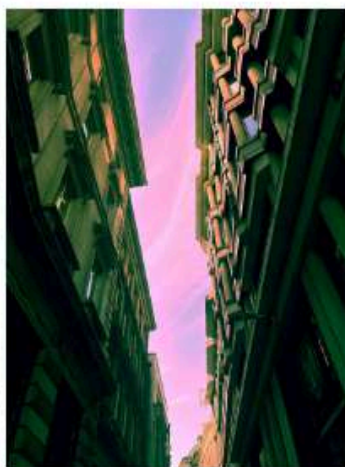

MEDICAL REMINDERS

As we enter cold and flu season, we kindly ask families to help us keep our school community healthy.

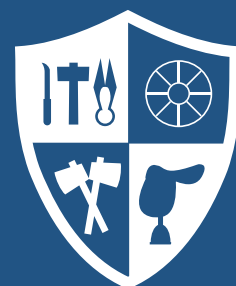
