I am sure they will all enjoy the creative and fun learning that is planned, and I look forward to seeing our Year 6 children in the Secondary School more often over the coming weeks.

Year 9 & 10 Medical Mavericks Academy - We have been given a fantastic opportunity by the University of Bedfordshire to take part in a programme called Medical Mavericks Academy.

It is an online course that gives the students the opportunity to learn about careers in the medical sector, but this is not just about medicine and the usual suspects when it comes to medical careers. They will have interviews and videos from doctors, nurses, midwives etc... with over 350 NHS careers to choose from. In addition to this, we have access to 2 live online events through this course.

- Guinea Pig Show: a presenter takes your students on a journey through Healthcare Science careers that perform 85% of all diagnostic tests in a hospital. Every career explored is accessible with 5 GCSEs at levels 9-4. It focusses on careers in Healthcare Science, all of which are accessible with 5 GCSEs at levels 9-4. The show covers: Vascular Science Cardiac Physiology Medical Engineering Renal & Urodynamics Ophthalmic Science Respiratory Physiology
- The Senses Show: What is the show about? We'll show your students how to perform 8 exciting experiments on their body and each other to discover how they work and explore some of the quirks of human physiology and their senses. We'll look at proprioception and make your arms float into the air, make everything in your vision shrink and grow, test your reflexes and much more.
