How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- Meet outside rather than inside where possible
- Try to keep 2 metres apart from people that you don't live with (unless you have formed a <u>support bubble</u> with them), this includes friends and family you don't life with
- Test twice a week and isolate if you are positive
- Get vaccinated when you are offered it, and encourage others to do so as well
