Parent Weekly Update - 23 October 2020

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week has been difficult for everyone, and I am sure you are all as pleased as we are to get to the half term break.

I apologise for the frequency of my messages to you all during the week, but it is important that I am completely transparent and that we all work together to combat this virus. We have been required to isolate a further group of students today. In summary, and at the time of writing, we have 3 students and 5 members of staff who have tested positive. The links have been difficult to establish, and we have had meetings with Public Health England to discuss each case and any actions required. We are aware that this area has one of the highest infection rates in Central Bedfordshire and children often have no symptoms. So, in school we have made a few changes to our procedures including advising the children to wear face masks, increased cleaning and limiting visitors.

Thank you for all your support and patience during this ever changing landscape, we are hugely grateful to the children, staff and parents/carers. Please may I ask you to **read the important letter** from Central Bedfordshire Public Health department and the details below on what to do if your child develops symptoms included in this bulletin regarding the rise in cases in Central Bedfordshire about what we can all do to help.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19 during half term

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands frequently with soap for at least 20 seconds, or use hand sanitiser
- Wear a face covering correctly when you are required to do so especially on public transport
- Keep 2 metres apart from anyone you do not live with.

They will be given 4 papers for combined science, each paper one hour and forty five minutes long. Revision sessions are taking place every Monday afterschool from 3.30 - 4.00pm in
