

This half term has started with a clear sense of direction and purpose. The Senior Leadership Team have been conducting learning walks across all years throughout the school, observing different lessons, speaking with pupils about their learning and looking at progress in pupils' books. The results from these observations have been overwhelmingly positive, showing that students truly enjoy their learning experiences.

We are delighted to share with you all that we have recently appointed Mrs Weekes as the new Parent Governor at Etonbury Academy and I would like to formally welcome Mrs Weekes to the post. Thank you to everyone who took the time to vote and for our parents who put themselves forward for the election. It is important that parents are represented on the Governing body and support the direction of travel for the school.

As Year 11 students count down the weeks until their GCSE exams, staff members are keenly aware that this period can be a particularly busy one for pupils as they finish their GCSE content and begin their revision. Year 11 teachers are offering a wide variety of intervention sessions during lunchtime and after school to provide support and reassurance. Students are encouraged to attend these sessions; any Year 11 student not yet participating in an intervention for a specific subject should consult their subject teacher for guidance on the appropriate times and days.

Last week, students from Years 5 to 8 in the ETA Young Voices club performed at the O2 Arena, showcasing a range of songs and choreography alongside over 7,000 other participants. The enthusiastic Etonbury students delivered a remarkable performance, highlighting the school's nurturing of talent and a love for music and the arts, thanks to the dedication of the staff involved.

Our Year 9 pupils are currently preparing to select their GCSE options, allowing them to personalise their curriculum options in line with their career aspirations. The school offers a wide variety of subjects, including Media Studies, Health and Social Care, Photography, Business Studies, Sociology, Psychology, and BTEC Sport. This presents a fantastic opportunity for students to explore different courses and make informed choices. Parents and carers are invited to the Year 9 Options Evening on February 26th.

Additionally, we recently hosted a 'Meet Your Mentor' evening for parents and carers of students in Years 5 to 9. This event allowed families to connect with academic mentors while students showcased their work. At Etonbury, students meet regularly with mentors to reflect on their progress, with mentors supporting them in achieving academic goals and learning outcomes.

Literacy and oracy continues to be a strong theme across Etonbury, as we recognise the importance these skills have in life. This half term, Year 7 and Year 9 students were treated to a visit from a local poet and speaker, Anthea Barclay. In a highly engaging presentation, Anthea explored ideas around positivity and the power of words. The sessions were very interactive, and many of our students spoke clearly and confidently to share their thoughts with our visitor, see photo below.

Please remember that our Form Tutors and Teachers are always available to answer any questions throughout the year; there's no need to wait for parents' evenings. Sending an email is often the most effective way to reach a member of the teaching staff, as they spend much of the day in the classroom with students.

As a school we have taken time this half term to reflect and remember two former pupils of Etonbury, peers of our current Year 13 pupils, our thoughts and condolences are shared with the families and they are remembered fondly by staff and pupils.




NEWS FROM YEAR 6!

A few reminders for you all; Please ensure that your child/ children arrive at school between 8:15am and before 8:25am. The Junior gate opens at 8:15am sharp and will close at 8:25am prompt. Your cooperation in ensuring punctuality is greatly appreciated. Please have a look at the uniform policy, which states that girls' skirts should be knee length.

Children should come to school fully equipped. Please can you ensure that your child's pencil case is checked regularly and restocked over the half term holiday so they have all the correct equipment for learning when they return. Pupils are asked not to bring gel or erasable pens to school due to longer drying times and smudging. Erasable pens are not suitable for edits in red, as feedback may be lost. Just this week, year 6 visited The Imperial War Museum in Duxford for their 'We Shall Never Forget' topic. They explored WWII planes and modern aircraft, including a Concorde prototype. Highlights included the Operations room, which they recognized from a 'Horrible Histories' video, and an audio-visual experience of the Battle of Britain on September 15, 1940. The 'Historic Duxford' building featured interactive displays. The site spans over a mile, requiring considerable walking, and everyone had an enjoyable day.

We have had pupils from years 5 to 8 rehearsing for Young Voices since September and performances take place at the O2 Arena (amongst other venues) each year. Those who were part of Young Voices thoroughly enjoyed the experience, we are immensely proud of them and grateful to all the staff involved in making the concert a resounding success. Events like these not only showcase the immense talent within our school, but also instil a love for music and the arts in our pupils.

The Junior Valentine's Disco was a great success, lots of fun was had by all, a huge thank you to the Sixth Form students who organised the event. It was a wonderful opportunity for pupils to socialise and express themselves through dance and have fun with their peers and teachers.

Next half term we have a Harry Potter theme to our topic - 'Wingardium Leviosa!' We will be reading "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone", linking in a range of writing genres. In maths we will study area, perimeter and volume, and statistics. Our focus in science will be Evolution and Inheritance.



SIXTH FORM UPDATES!

This half term began with mock exams for year 13s, as well as some real exams for the BTEC students. Our students approached these assessments with commitment and this hard work has been reflected in some great results. I spoke to year 13s last week about how to reflect on these results and use the next few months effectively with a growth mindset approach. Students should be taking on feedback from the mocks and re-drafting work in light of this, completing past papers, reading examiner reports and attending the extra intervention sessions teachers are kindly holding to support the students.

January saw the UCAS deadline and this year students have applied for a wide range of university courses such as finance, economics, law, psychology, physiotherapy, criminology, geophysics, film production, aerospace and civil engineering to name but a few. We are also extremely proud that, for the first time, one of our Etonbury Sixth Formers has received an offer from Oxford University to read biochemistry next academic year. Our focus now turns to the students applying for apprenticeships; supporting them with writing CVs, as well as interview and assessment centre advice.

We are currently organising a trip to the UCAS discovery event in London for year 12s in March. This event is the perfect way for students to choose which university or apprenticeship is right for them and will provide attendees with the opportunity to discover all their options under one roof. UCAS can help students find out about traditional degrees, apprenticeships, careers, and we hope students will come back with a clearer understanding of their post 18 options. Year 12s have also started to find work experience placements for July. If you are able to offer a work experience placement to one of our brilliant students, we would love to hear from you.

The year 12s are busy in the final stages of planning a Valentine's disco for the Juniors. This annual celebration gives the students first-hand experiences of organising an event, such as producing risk assessments, purchasing the food and drinks, designing advertisements and calculating potential incomings and outgoings to ensure we make a profit. This experience and development of transferable skills is great for students to reflect on in future applications, as well as bringing the school community together.

Performing Arts

We are busy with our BTEC tech award performances and coursework. Year 10s are working hard on their Wicked Musical Theatre Coursework and Year 11s are in the process of creating devised drama for their final component.

Year 7 are working on their puppetry unit and finding out how to plan a Japanese Bunraku puppet through masterclasses on skills and techniques such as breathing, emotion and focus. We also had a wonderful drama teacher who is supporting the department this term, who is bringing so much enthusiasm and knowledge to support all our pupils - thank you to Mr Noble Layng, the pupils have loved working with you this term and it is fantastic to work with such expertise in the department.

Year 8 have performed their 'Theatre in Education' assessments for year 5 target audiences this term and it was wonderful to get peer feedback from primary groups to help our year 8 pupils understand what they need to do to improve and focus on moving forward in their professional practice.

Year 9 pupils have been introduced to BTEC option in Performing Arts through two masterclasses about the requirements of the course and the content. Pupils enjoyed exploring the design and acting pathways available to study and we look forward to seeing you at options evening to discuss your child's suitability for a performing arts course with us to develop their interest and talent.

We have a strong cohort of twenty LAMDA actors from key stage 2-3 preparing for their exams in the summer with our West End Professionals running our acting school after school on a Monday.

There is a trip coming up for year 10 to watch Wicked the musical on 25th March. This supports their coursework; the pupils will travel to London where they will get a chance to meet the production team for a post-show Q and A session. We are all very excited for this trip next month.

Our arts leaders have worked in collaboration with the teaching and learning assistant principal on a new assembly this term. Pupils will use their drama skills in an interactive assembly to get pupils thinking about attitudes to learning.

After the two night sell out success of our large scale, whole school production 'Rocking Around The World' at Christmas, we are starting to plan for next year's performance. We are busy planning a culture day for next year for the whole school with an exciting performance to showcase talent.

This will culminate in an evening showcase performance for the community. We have joined a cultural network across central Bedfordshire that will allow us to develop our outreach in the community through our involvement in this wider cultural connect network.



Mrs Brahmachari-Limb is continually looking for, supporting and encouraging pupils to explore their talent at regional and national level. *Shivrel* is one of our talented year 11 Performing Arts pupils who has secured a National Theatre audition in February. 


We have invested in lots of exciting new technical design equipment and have started using LCD boards in drama. The pupils are enjoying using them in their lessons already.




