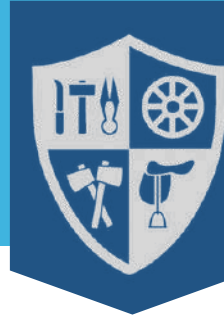

# Bedfordshire Schools Trust is celebrating 10 year anniversary!

*The Bedfordshire Schools Trust (BEST) celebrated a successful first decade in May, marked by significant growth from its six founding schools to a robust multi-academy trust. Since its inception, the trust has added several academies, increased pupil numbers by over 120%, established nurseries, and achieved a "good or better" rating for all schools.*

Earlier this month we planted a silver birch tree to celebrate 10 years of BEST and being a founding member of the Bedfordshire Schools Trust. In celebrating a decade of growth and unity, each birch tree planted by the Trust at the 11 schools and 5 nurseries stands as a living symbol of the shared commitment to nurturing future generations and providing high quality education and support.

Key milestones in the first decade include:

- Establishment of partnerships with Etonbury, Gothic Mede, Gravenhurst, Langford Village, Robert Bloomfield, and Samuel Whitbread Academies, plus nurseries in Arlesey and Shefford.
- Growth with the addition of St Christopher's Academy (2017), Lawnside Academy (2019), Campton Academy (2020), and Pix Brook Academy (2019).
- Ongoing expansion with Castle Newnham (September 2024) and a new Sixth Form at Etonbury Academy (September 2023).

Dr Alan Lee, CEO gave a speech to include; *'It's actually a week today that we are 10 years old, it's been a wonderful 10 years, to watch Etonbury grow with us. When I first joined the Trust, it was a middle school and then an extended secondary school. To watch it grow is wonderful. I was talking to Henry, an aspiring Oxford student in the Etonbury Sixth Form earlier about his time here and his career aspirations. Henry has been here since year 5, so studied here for about 9 years. Excellence comes from planning and we can see the planning here today, so very, very grateful.'*

Mrs Young, Principal of Etonbury Academy expressed her gratitude: *'Thank you to our CEO, the BEST Trustees and Central Team, our Chair of Governors and our pupil representatives for joining us and supporting this special occasion. The planting of the silver birch tree is a very special celebration of 10 years of BEST and Etonbury's shared commitment to growth, education, success and the pupils within our local community.'*

### Encouraging Reading Among ETA Juniors

All junior students are encouraged to read aloud to an adult as part of their English homework at least three times a week.

Their Orange Books are reviewed weekly at school, and upon completion, they earn an Orange Stamp. Once they accumulate six Orange Stamps, they can join the 'Orange Book Club' held on Thursday lunchtimes, where they can select a reward book to celebrate their efforts and achievements. Additionally, they are recognised during our celebration assemblies.

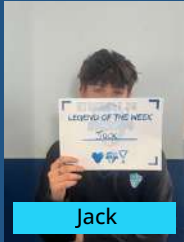

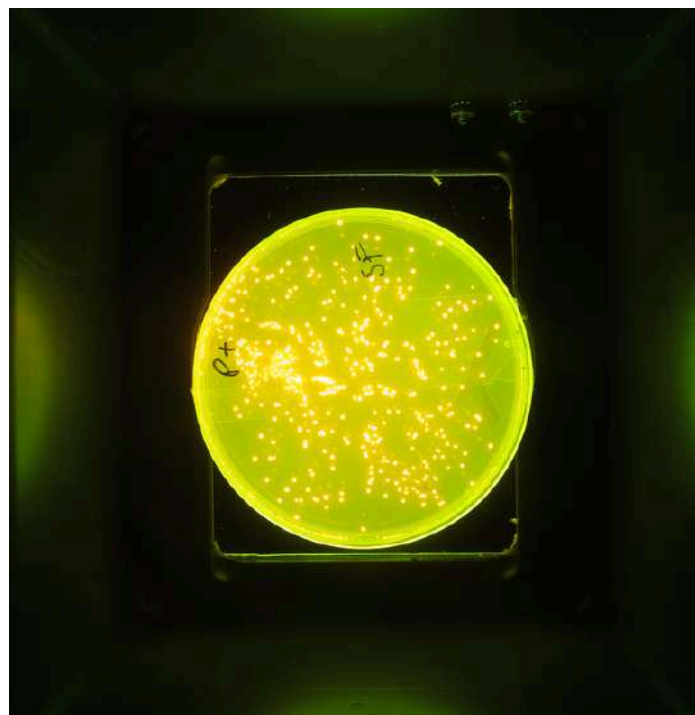

# AMGEN Biotech Experience!



## RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES FOR ETONBURY SIXTH FORM.

A few years ago, Etonbury Science department started a partnership with the AMGEN Biotech experience team at the University of Hertfordshire Hatfield campus with a view to giving our A-level students the opportunity to use research equipment that would normally only be available to science undergraduates.

This year was no exception so our year 12 biology class did DNA manipulation, transferring a fluorescent protein gene from one DNA plasmid to another. BTEC Forensic students got hands-on with DNA fingerprinting and gel electrophoresis, such as the procedures used in crime detection.

Year 13 Biologists, who had done the DNA manipulation last year, got the chance to extend their knowledge of this cutting-edge technology by creating a glow-in-the-dark bacteria that was resistant to a particular antibiotic. They were able to use a PCR machine, or thermal cycler, to create millions of copies of this DNA and a Gel imaging system to record images of their plates for later analysis.

The students were able to practice with Gilson pipettes, working with extremely small volumes of liquids, and were able to appreciate the importance of accuracy and attention to detail. This experience helps to deepen their understanding of genetics, and gives them an insight into potential careers that build on these techniques.

# SIXTH FORM UPDATES!

It has been an incredibly successful start to the Summer term in the Sixth Form, filled with inspiring trips and outstanding student achievements.

Our students continue to demonstrate exceptional talent and curiosity across the curriculum: Our A-level Chemistry students excelled in the Royal Society of Chemistry Olympiad, competing against over 17,000 students nationwide. We are thrilled to celebrate six Bronze awards (Finley, Riley, Niamh, Lucas, Chloe, and Shahir) and an impressive Gold award earned by Henry B, which is only awarded to the top 10% of participants across the country.

Year 12 geography students enjoyed a productive trip to Sheringham to collect data for their coursework, where they were praised for being a credit to the school.

Year 12 students visited the UCAS Discovery Day in London, where they met with university representatives from across the UK and attended seminars on crafting standout personal statements.

Beyond the classroom, our students continue to inspire us with their extra-curricular triumphs, such as Abi playing for Arsenal U21s, who recently won the league—a truly amazing achievement! We are especially proud of how our students continue to support younger students in lessons and in their reading clubs, on top of managing their own workload.

We are committed to ensuring every student is supported as they branch out into life beyond Sixth Form and this term has seen the year 13s make their final university choices, as well as lots of apprenticeship applications and interviews taking place. Students who intend to go to university have also been applying to the Connolly Foundation for bursaries to help support them whilst studying. Last year, the charity awarded over £7000 to our students to help with university costs and we are extremely grateful to them for this.

The year 12s have also been attending careers appointments to help them with the post-18 plans and are busy securing a week's work experience in June. We are always grateful to the many businesses in our local community who will be supporting our students with their placements and would love to hear from anyone who thinks they may be able to help.

CRIME SCENE DO NOT CROSS

# BTEC Forensic Crime scene day 2026



As part of their Forensic Science qualification, our BTEC students are required to study various techniques for evidence-gathering and analysis and the best way to do this is to set up an entire "crime scene" for them to process.

## ***"There's been a murder!"***

Our crime scene revolved around the scene of the suspicious death of our victim with fibres, powders, "blood" and footprints to photograph, catalogue and sample.

## ***"Leaving no stone unturned!"***

The students were then able to use real-world procedural techniques to analyse their samples and draw conclusions as to which of their suspects was the guilty party.



They were able to use fingerprint dusting equipment on more regular surfaces and used superglue fuming to develop the prints from more difficult surfaces such as glass. Using a presumptive Kastle-Meyer test they were able to detect the presence of blood and used further tests to establish a blood group.

One of the primary pieces of evidence – the "bloody" footprint – was a key piece in building their case along with a threatening note written in the defendant's handwriting that was found in the victim's pocket.

## ***"Let justice prevail!"***

Although this crime scene was, of course, orchestrated with fake blood, had clear and visible fingerprints and an anonymous victim who was merely a chalk outline (the victim had to get back to lessons and was unable to be a body for the whole day), this experience gave our students an opportunity to apply the techniques they have learned in their lessons and their research to build a case for prosecution. They also discussed the ability of the evidence to clear suspects of involvement in the crime and the ambiguity and shortcomings of these procedures as well as the use of circumstantial evidence to build a case.

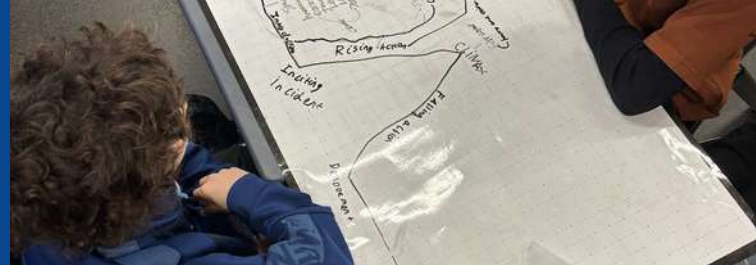

Students have enjoyed utilizing large whiteboards to enhance their collaborative group projects.

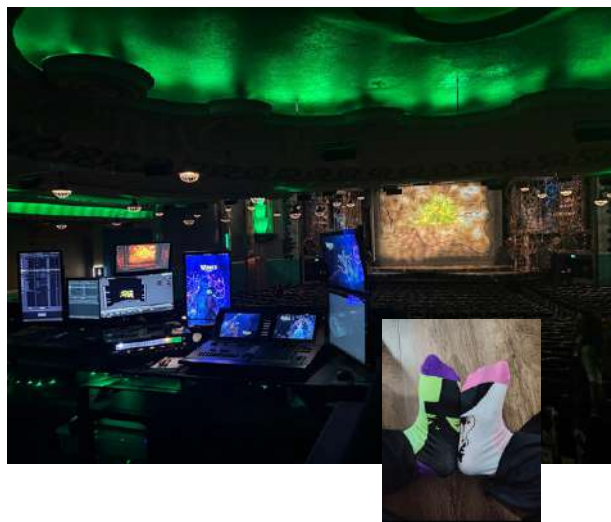
