Revise B1: DNA Structure, Key terminology, Genetic Diagrams, genetic testing and the ethical issues around genetic testing and genetic engineering. Triple Science - 3 papers 75 marks each. Revise B1 and B2, C1 and C2, P1 and P2. |
