

Subject	Topics to revise for the mock exam
English Literature	Paper 1: Shakespeare and 19th Century Novel. Shakespeare: Depending on which text you have studied revise quotations and context for either Much Ado About Nothing or Romeo and Juliet. 19th Century Novel: Depending on which text you have studied revise quotations and context for either Jane Eyre, A Christmas Carol or Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde. Paper2: 20th Century Novel, Cluster Poetry and Unseen Poetry. 20th Century Novel: Depending on which text you have studied revise quotations and context for either Animal Farm, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night or An Inspector Calls. Poetry: All Students should revise all poems, make sure you are aware of quotations and context for each of them. Students should also be aware of linking poems and be able to compare the poems from the power and conflict cluster. Students should also practise poetry analysis in order to be able to answer the unseen poetry question. Exam Technique: Students should practise using PETER structure to answer all Literature questions.
English Language	Paper 1: Fiction - Section A: Practise analysing and evaluating fictional texts (Q2,3 and 4). Section B: Practise creative and descriptive writing, focus on using linguistic devices, paragraphs and accurate SPaG (Q5). Paper 2: Non-Fiction - Section A: Practise summarising, analysing and comparing non fiction texts (Q2, 3,4). Section B: Practise writing to argue, explain, persuade or advise. Make sure you are aware how to write in the format of a letter, article, essay, leaflet and speech. Focus on using linguistic devices and accurate SPaG (Q5).
Mathematics	Algebra, linear and quadratic equations, simultaneous equations, inequalities, direct and inverse proportion, transformations, pythagoras, trigonometry, sine and cosine rule, congruence and similarity, scale diagrams and bearings, properties of polygons, indices, surds, probability, angles, ratio and proportion, perimeter, area and volume, numerical methods.
Science	Combined Science - Students taking the Higher paper need to revise, B1, C1, P1, B2, B4, C2, P2. Students taking the foundation paper need to revise B1, C1, P1, B2, B4, C3,P2. Triple Science - B1,B2, B4, C1, C2, C3, P1, P2, P3
Computer Science	All theory for Paper 1 and Paper 2. The spec is available online, see Mr Kirkman for information about textbooks/revision guides.
Geography	Paper 1: the living world (rainforests and deserts), natural hazards. Paper 2: challenge of urban environments, resource management.
History	Paper 1: Surgery and Treatment in WW1. Revision should focus on improvements to treatment and medical advances. Cold War. Revision should focus on the origins of the Cold War, Berlin Blockade, NATO and Warsaw Pact, Arms Race, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Berlin Wall, Detente, Afghanistan, collapse of Communism (including pressure from the USA through programs such as the SDI) Paper 2: Russia 1917-1941. Revision should focus on Marxism, the October Revolution, the Civil War, War Communism, the purge and the Red Terror, the New Economic Policy, Collectivisation and the 5 Year Plans.
MFL (Spanish)	Students will sit Listening Paper 1, Reading Paper 2 Writing Paper 4. For all three papers students need to revise the holiday, school, technology and relationship topics that we have covered. Students need to be able to recognise and use present, preterite and future tense as a minimum. They should also be secure with core vocabulary covered in each of the topics covered so far.
Business Studies	Unit 1 and Unit 2 - all topics. All presentations and key terms are on Google Classroom along with Summary revision presentations for each unit.
Dance	Focus on the critical appreciation (trio dances Christina Marks has choreographed) Study the following professional dance works. Practical- Focusing on your choreography, Trio performances and set phrases.
Design Technology	Paper 1 (Written exam paper 50%) Section A and B Focus on tolerances, types of plastic, working properties of materials, gears, orthographic projection, renewable and non renewable energy sources, ecological issues, technology push and market pull, fair trade, planned obsolescence, CAD/CAM, smart materials, electronic systems, flat pack furniture Section C Evaluation of design factors, writing a specification, existing designers, iterative design approach. Maths content - surface area, percentages, lengths of sides of a triangle, missing values, bar charts.
Drama	Unit 1 (WRITTEN EXAM PAPER) (40%) Ensure you know the types of stage configurations (end on , proscenium) as well as the positions on stage (USL, DSR). Also know the various roles and responsibilities of named jobs, ie. stage manager, set designer, director, box office) . Section 2- Ensure that you re read Blood Brothers the set text, (Methuen version) and go on GCSE Bitesize and complete all the GCSE activities on Blood Brothers. Answer exam questions to practice (past exam paper questions on Google Classroom). Look at excellent examples of written responses on google classroom and try your own version using the models as examples of excellence. Section 3- Research Billy Elliot the production (West End version) on line, create mind maps and use these to practice writing theatre reviews under timed conditions, see examples on Google Classroom for What a Good One Looks Like. Unit 2 (40%)- (DEvised GROUP PRACTICAL) Make sure students have collected all their resources and know exactly what they are saying/doing/presenting and are ready for their practical performance (see timetable). Unit 3- (PERFORMANCE EXAM) (20%) Find a monologue/duologue and research the background of the play. Annotate your monologue/duologue on how you see this stage. Have a full copy of this script with annotations available on the day (any problems, let teacher know in advance of the exam day). Students must wear black non-uniform on the day, see timetable.

Media Studies	Paper 1 (40%) 1hour 30 minutes. Focus on Media Language, Representaiton, Industry and Audience, Students are to revise from black folders the set texts and fact sheets. Students should also refer to and use the revision guide provided via Google Classroom.
P.E.	Topics to revise: health fitness and wellbeing, sport psychology, socio-cultural influences, physical training. You need to go over everything you have learnt in year 9 and year 10 to date. Your exam will consist of multiple choice questions, short answer questions, and 9 mark questions.
Psychology	Topics to revise: Memory, Perception, Development and Social influence. The paper will be 1hr 45 minutes. There will be a 9 mark question per topic. Remember to revise the key studies for each topic - these are starred in the textbook.
Sociology	Students will be completing Paper 1: The sociology of families and education and questions on relevant areas of social theory and methodology. Students will be expected to draw on knowledge and understanding of everything they have looked at so far to show a deeper understanding of these topics. It will equate to 50% of the course. Section A has two multiple choice questions followed by a range of short and extended responses. Section B has two multiple choice questions followed by a range of short and extended responses. Revision will be part of homework up until the mock exams linking to specific units weekly. Please use your class book and your sociology AQA text book to support,
Food Prep and Nutrition	Hygiene and safety: including use by / best before dates. Nutrition: including vitamins and minerals. Malnutrition - excess and deficiencies. Nutritional requirements for a teenager. Cooking methods and food science linked to cooking food. Organic food and food miles. Allergens. Roles of ingredients in cooking e.g. eggs. Food provenance.
BTEC Animal Care	Mock exam will take place in year 11. Time will be spent on amending assignments during the mock exam weeks.
BTEC Childcare	Mock exam will take place in year 11. Time will be spent on amending assignments during the mock exam weeks.
BTEC Sport	Mock exam will take place in year 11. Time will be spent on amending assignments during the mock exam weeks.
Latin	Roman Civ: gladiators, Roman baths, amphitheatres, theatre Language paper: All grammar and all vocabulary, reading comprehension skills and translation skills
Art	Students should be preparing resources and ideas for the final piece to their project 'Coastal Environments' which they will complete in the mock exam which takes place 21st and 22nd March this contributes to the 60% coursework overall GCSE grade
Photography	Students should be preparing resources and ideas for the final piece to their project 'Where is My Mind' which they will complete in the mock exam the week after the Easter Holidays this contributes to the 60% coursework overall GCSE grade
