I have organised for the Junior school council to be broken down into 3 major committees, these will act as the pillars that will shape the Junior school council. A Google classroom has also been set up in order to aid communication to Junior form classes via their form prefects. I also run the Junior Maths Program at Etonbury.

This allows there to be optional homework and the slide presentations are accessible to the JMP students even when they get home. We have many students in the team who all have opportunities to lead activities, working as curriculum champions running clubs, working alongside curriculum leaders. MaxM has set up a wonderful new circus skills club at KS3 in Performing Arts and is working as a champion in this area. I am looking forward to working with all our elected prefects and wider student voice team who have been elected by their form tutors to represent the year group's. I think that these roles are so important as pupil voice is incredibly important and we ensure that as soon as students start at ETA, pupils have their voice heard and play a part in supporting e ta -curricular and curricular activities.
