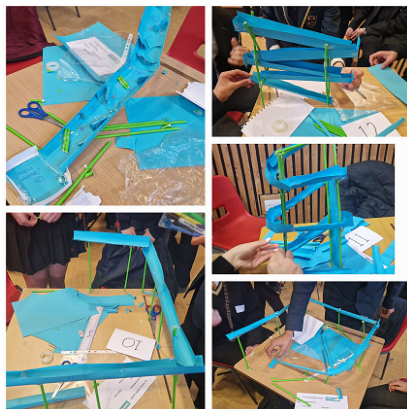
## Principal Message

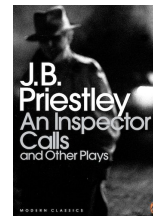

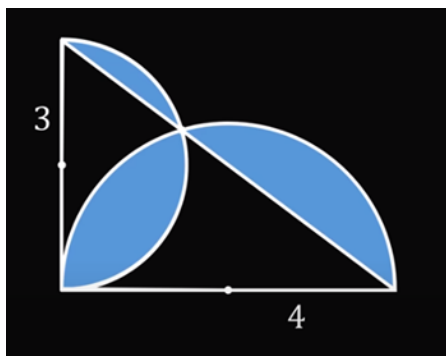

## Year 11 Art & Photography

As we are approaching the end of the GCSE Art & Photography course, I wanted to write to you again to remind you of the deadlines approaching, exam dates and the interventions we have on offer to support the students.



Dates for the 10 hour ESA exam are as follows:

- 113/Art Miss Smith & 113/Photography Mrs Fox-Connor Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April & Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> April 2024
- 111/Art Mrs Fox-Connor & 111/Photography Miss Smith Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May & 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2024

In preparation for the exam, students will need all of their sketchbook work and the tasks on their structure sheets complete so that they are prepared and know exactly what they will be doing for their final piece which they will be completing over the 2 days in the 10 hour exam. Students are not allowed to work on this project once the exam has finished. Please remind them to bring in their sketchbooks on the exam day as it has to be present.

### Interventions and Support

These will be resolved within the same exam day and indicated on their printed timetable which will also show rooming and seat allocations. This will be handed out to students before the end of term.

## Contingency Days

There are contingency sessions within the Summer 2024 exam timetable - the afternoon of **6 June** and **13 June 2024** and the morning and afternoon of **26 June 2024**.

We appreciate your child might finish their exams earlier than this, but ask that they are available on all three dates even if they do not have an exam.

The awarding bodies have collectively decided on these contingency days, and are allocated in case of an event of national or significant local disruption to examinations in the UK.

All students have received detailed information from their subject teachers regarding their specific exam dates.

Timeslots will be notified to the students via their subject teacher in due course.
