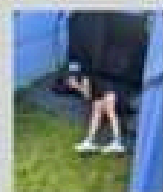
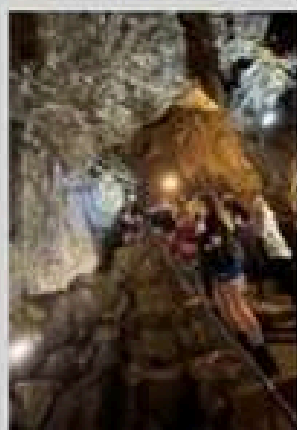
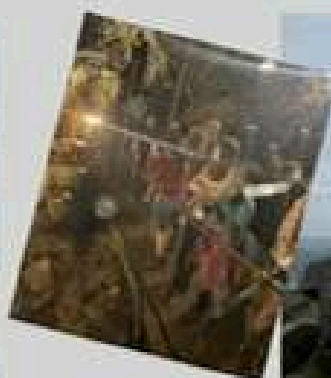
The Duke of Edinburgh SILVER expedition went really well, with everyone working together and showing great determination. It took place on the 26th-28th June in the Peak District.
